Diocesan Tuition Fees Schedule 2014

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is only charged for the first three (3) children currently enrolled in the diocese (in other words there is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools - see 'Sibling Discounts' below). To work out how much the fee is for each child, check the table below.

Diocesan Building Levy

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2014 is \$669 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$223 payable in terms one, two and three.

Annual Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee

The Diocesan Temporary Residents Education Fee for 2014 is \$1,650 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$550 in terms one, two and three. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090. Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a per family basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

RESOURCE FEE

We have an annual resource fee per child which assists the school to budget for the materials and resources used for the children's benefit. The 2014 fee is \$175.00 and is reviewed each year. The classroom items covered by this charge include paint, brushes, cardboard, art paper, craft materials, recreational reading books, Mathematics equipment and paper. Computer software and supplies also receive an allocation. Additionally this fee also provides the children with text books, exercise books, pencil cases, music folders and other stationery items that are required for the year.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

CTK's focus is on developing Technology throughout the school. This process involves the purchase of laptops, maintenance and software etc. There is an annual Technology fee of \$70 per family, This fee appears on your Term 1 account.

EXCURSION / INCURSION FEE

We have an annual excursion / incursion fee of \$55 per child which assists the school to budget for these events. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all excursions and incursions e.g. Life Education, Book Week speakers etc. for the year and appears on your Term 1 account.

CARNIVAL FEE

We have an annual carnival fee of \$30 per child which assists the school to budget for our Swimming and Athletics carnivals. The fee is reviewed each year. This fee covers all carnivals for the year and appears on your Term 1 account.

Other CTK Fees for 2014

Other CTK school curriculum activities which incur fees include Mathletics, Reading Eggs, Surf Education, Sports in Schools Australia (Term 1) and Dance Multisport (Terms 2, 3, 4), and camps etc. These activities vary from year to year.

Looking Good - SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE: Is your child wearing the correct hat?

Thank you to all the parents who have taken a lot of trouble to prepare the children for school. The children look very smart in their uniforms which gives them a strong sense of identity and add to their positive self esteem as they take pride in their appearance.

A reminder that shoes need to be regulation school shoes (i.e. no high/chunky heels or soles that are bad for posture and could result in an ankle injury. For boys and girls, hair needs to be neat and tidy.

The official CTK school hat is the bucket hat which is available for purchase at the Uniform Shop. Please ensure your child has their hat with them everyday. CTK has a 'no hat, no play' policy.

Any variations to the uniform etc. are always questioned so should be accompanied by a note.



Morning Drop-Off Parents are reminded that when dropping off their children in the morning the following guidelines apply:

- * Supervision of children begins at 8:15am
- * Always drive less than 5km per hour within the school grounds
- * Always have children leave the vehicle on the passenger side only.
- * Always use the crossing

Only park in <u>designated</u> parking spaces around the hall, never on the top playground unless there is a major school function, and only then after 9.00am as latecomers may still be walking across the playground.

CHILD PROTECTION—CEO PARRAMATTA MODULE & THE NEW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK



The Working with Children Check is a three step process which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Roads & Maritime Service (RMS) Office (formally RTA) for screening which completes the check.

PLEASE NOTE: Partial Completion of the above steps will not be accepted. Completion of only the CEO Module will not allow you to assist in the classroom

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at:

http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.

2. When module has been completed go to: www.kids.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

The Working With Children Check remains free for:

- Volunteers and students
- Authorised carers

- Potential adoptive parents
- Adults who reside in the home of:
 - an authorised carer
 - a family day care service provider
- a home-based education and care service provider.
- **3.** Once the RMS check has been completed you will receive an email which will state that you have clearance to work with children. **You will need** to present a copy of the RMS email to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.

LIBRARY NEWS

Welcome back to another great year of learning and reading year in the Holy Faith Library. This year we will be focussing on reading for pleasure and information literacy skills to teach students how to become successful and critical uses of the internet. Library borrowing will commence by Week 4 so please ensure your child has their library bag each week, these bags protect the school's library resources and help your child to locate their books each week.

We are looking for parents and grandparents who are available to help re-shelve books in the library or to cover books at home. If you are able to help out on a Wednesday please drop a note into the office with your name and contact details or see the library staff. Thank you in anticipation for your continued support in the library.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2014

Congratulations to over 180 students from Christ the King who completed the PRC in 2013. This was a wonderful achievement although this year we would like to see every child complete the challenge. Kindergarten through to Year 2 need to read 30 books (25 from the challenge) and Year 3 to Year 6 need to read 20 books (15 from the challenge). More details will be coming home in the next week and your child's Personal Reading Log will be distributed by the class teacher. Please note that I will not be giving out PRC log in details until the beginning of Term 3. Remember to keep a record of each book title, author and PRC ID on your child's Personal Reading Log. Books that have been read over the Christmas holiday can be included. The Holy Faith Library has a large collection of labelled PCR books for each of the age groups and your local library also supports the PRC.

2014 Subscriptions

This year Christ the King will again be subscribing to various online databases and tools to supplement your child's learning. These online subscriptions involve a rollover process that will be completed over the next few weeks. Passwords will be issued as soon as possible.

SYDNEY ACADEMY OF CHESS Term 1 lessons begin in Week 3. Registration forms available next week.

This program will take place on Wednesday afternoons from 3pm—4pm in the Holy Faith Library, **beginning on Wednesday**, 12th February (Week 3). This program is independently run by the Sydney Academy of Chess. *Please note that priority is given to children who are genuinely interested and are old enough to benefit from the program*.

Learning and playing chess helps children develop their logical thinking and problem solving skills, improves their concentration and focus, while also being a great source of enjoyment. Activities include group lessons on a demonstration chess board or interactive whiteboard, puzzle solving and fun practice games. Students earn merit awards by making checkmates, or by displaying skills and positive qualities, which all good chess players strive to develop.
