Feast Of The Assumption

Last Saturday was the Feast of the Assumption. The Feast of the Assumption is an important day in the life of the Church. It is the principal feast of the Blessed Virgin, the mother of Jesus Christ. This feast commemorates two events - the departure of Mary from this life and the assumption of her body into heaven. The Church's official doctrine of the Assumption says that at the end of her life on earth Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven. Pope Pius XII, in 1950, defined that Mary "after the completion of her earthly life...was assumed body and soul into the glory of Heaven." Her body wasn't allowed to corrupt nor was it allowed to remain in a tomb.

The Church teaches us that Mary willingly accepted God's invitation to be the mother of Jesus and that she welcomed parenthood and the vital job of nurturing her son and helping him grow in his understanding of who he was. She prayed constantly for guidance and opened her heart to the presence of God.

This prayer helps us to advance in wisdom and understanding that sometimes learning takes time, perseverance and courage.

Healthy Harold is the mascot of Life Education whose aim is to empower our children and young people to make safer and healthier choices through education. At Life Education we believe that all children deserve to lead safe and healthy lives. By placing preventive education at the core of our work we want to instil in children the confidence to make safer and healthier choices now and in the future.

Students at CTK will visit the Life education van over the next few days. Each grades program is below.

Parents are invited to visit the van on Tuesday afternoon 25th August from 200pm - 2.55pm.

Kindergarten - Harold's Surprise

Harold and the class are invited to Possum's party in the park. The class helps Harold to pack healthy picnic food and along the way we encounter various situations relating to:

seeking help from trusted adults

benefits of physical activity

body knowledge and self-assertion skills

Year 1 - Harold's Mystery Tour

Harold invites the class to attend a mystery tour in a special bus. On a humorous journey they visit a variety of places including The Full Body Experience, a beach and a waterslide. They discuss issues and engage in activities centred on:

the function of internal body parts e.g. heart, lungs

safety in public places

safe use and storage of medicines

appropriate remedies for illness

exploring strategies to manage feelings and emotions

Year 2 - Harold's Heroes

Harold invites the class to join him and his Super-Hero Team. The team's job is to make our environment a healthier and safer place for everyone. Class members become Super-Heroes by interacting with the A-V and suggesting solutions to the problems. The Super-Heroes fly to the rescue and facilitate the exploration of:

local environmental and health issues including pollution/passive smoking

issues around individual need for medicines and their safe use and storage

emergency (drug) procedures

safe and unsafe behaviours and environments

Year 3 - Mind Your Medicine

Using a game show format Mind Your Medicine explores issues relating to:

factors that can contribute to a person's sense of self-worth

dimensions of health such as physical, social, emotional and environmental

effective communication as an essential component of maintaining positive relationships

medicines as drugs and the consequences of their misuse

Year 4 - Cyberwise

Explores cybersafety through animation, vox pops of children, relevant scenarios, discussion and problem solving. An interactive, student centred session on:

building positive relationships with online and offline friends

safe and respectful behaviour online

responsible behaviours when using communication technology

strategies for keeping personal information safe online

strategies to deal with face to face and cyberbullying

exploring the role of bystanders

Year 5 - It's Your Call

It's Your Call utilises a range of trigger videos, quizzes and problem solving models to cover content such as:
short term and long term consequences of a range of legal drugs
factors that influence health and behaviour e.g. friends, media, family, digital communications
laws relating to the sale, advertising and use of a variety of legal drugs
skills and strategies to deal with unsafe situations and social dilemmas
safe and appropriate use of communication technology

Year 6 - Think Twice

Using a range of audio visual triggers Think Twice covers issues such as: short and long term physical, social and legal consequences of alcohol use campaigns and community initiatives to educate people about the harms of alcohol use laws governing the advertising, sale and use of alcohol myths surrounding the use of alcohol personal strategies to reduce alcohol related harm

Recipe of the week

3 Ingredient Fruit Cake

INGREDIENTS

1kg mixed dried fruit750ml iced coffee (store bought)2 cups self-raising flour

METHOD

- 1. Soak fruit in iced coffee overnight in the refriderator
- 2. Preheat oven to 180° degrees C. Line 22cm round cake tin with baking paper.
- 3. Sift self-raising flour over soaked fruit and stir until combined.
- 4. Pour mixture into tin and bake 1 hour
- 5. Test cake by inserting skewed into the centre of the cake. Continue to cook until the skewer comes out clean.
