# Band News



**Concert Band Folders** – if your child has been given a school Concert Band Folder (all senior students) this folder is to be returned back to the school no later than TOMORROW, Friday December 13. Any students who have not returned their folder by this date will be invoiced a replacement fee. Folders can be returned to Mr Lavis at morning band or to the front office.

**Band Week 10** – Year 5&6 students will be away for lessons tomorrow but should still come along to morning band (no instruments required) so we can have our annual band breakfast and year 6 farewell. **New Enrolments, 2014** – by now all our new band members should have received their enrolment pack. Before returning your enrolment form we ask that you give serious consideration to your child's choice to join band. Band is fun, educational and opens doors to new and amazing experiences but with these benefits come some very important points to consider.

*\*Will your child practise?! Do they have the time?* - It is recommended that students practise their instrument **at least** 4 times every week for **at least** 15-20min each practise. If your child already has numerous after school commitments or a hectic social life, this may be unlikely and their progress (and confidence) will suffer.

*\*Will your child catch up on missed school work?* - students miss, on average, 35-40min of class time each week for their band lesson. Generally they will not miss an entire lesson and will typically catch up on the day but if they are not completing their homework already and are unable to work independently to catch up on missed work perhaps it would be more suitable for them to enrol in external 'private' tuition outside of school hours rather than TSA's group tuition during the day.

*\*Will your child attend morning band on time?* - the biggest struggle after getting students to practise is to ensure they attend morning rehearsal punctually and regularly. Discuss this with your child and get their guarantee that they will pack their bag early on Thursday night and have a good night sleep before band so they never have to be dragged kicking and screaming out of bed on a Friday morning.

Watching and playing violent and mature themed shows and games can desensitise our children to the consequences of our actions and inhibit the development of empathy. ### CHILD PROTECTION—CEO PARRAMATTA MODULE & THE NEW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK



The Working with Children Check is now a **three step process** which includes Completion of the CEO Online Child Protection Module and Completion of the 'new working with children check' through the NSW Commission for Children website. Applicants will then need to present the completed documentation at their local Roads & Maritime Service (RMS) Office (formally RTA) for screening which completes the check.

1. It is a Diocesan requirement that any parent volunteering at Christ the King School complete the Child Protection training module.

This training is to be completed online at :

<http://childprotection.parra.catholic.edu.au>

CTK will receive email notification when you complete the CEO module.  
The Child Protection module **MUST** be completed every 2 years.

2. When module has been completed go to: **www.kids.nsw.gov.au** and follow the links to complete the 'new working with children check'. A Working With Children Check is a prerequisite for anyone in child-related work. It involves a national criminal history check and review of findings of workplace misconduct.

Only paid workers in child-related work are required to pay the \$80 fee for a five year clearance. This equates to \$16 per year, the lowest in Australia (together with Victoria).

*The Working With Children Check remains free for:*

- Volunteers and students
- Potential adoptive parents
- Authorised carers
- Adults who reside in the home of:
  - an authorised carer
  - a family day care service provider
  - a home-based education and care service provider.

3. Once the RMS check has been completed you will receive an email which will state that you have clearance to work with children. A copy of the RMS email will need to be presented to the school office to complete your Working with Children Check. **Only then** will you be cleared to work with the children in the school.

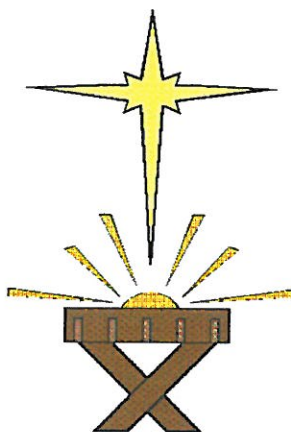
