After much pondering over this Sunday's scripture readings, I have left the reflection to an Australian Scripture Scholar- Dianne Bergant CSS to share her thoughts and insights. The overarching theme of the readings for this Sunday is 'words spoken in truth'. On one level, the laws are the words of the covenant. They are part of the contract that was drawn up between God and the people. They are words of truth, because they are the reliable revelation of God and because they genuinely reflect righteous living. The biblical covenant laws are truly humane. Obedience to the words of the covenant leads to life and blessings, while disobedience results in the opposite. When the word of God has taken root in us, everything becomes a religious practice. This word can come to us through the teachings of our faith, through the example of good people around us, through the wonder and mystery of creation. When it does take hold of us, our inner eye is opened, our hearts are softened, and we turn instinctively to God like a flower turns to the sun. When we are brought to birth in this way, covenant law becomes sacred, religious practices are cherished, and we are filled with the power that saves.

Happy Fathers day to all our Fathers and the significant men in our lives. Sunday is a great opportunity for us all to thank our dads for all they do and sacrifice for us. Let's take the time on this special day to tell dad we love him. Thanks to all those who contributed to making our breakfast and celebrations this morning. 
FINAL WEEK TO ADD YOUR BOOKS TO THE WEBSITE

PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE 2018

The PRC finishes on the 31st August 2018. All reading records must be entered onto the website by this date. I will then have one week to validate all student records. Student passwords have been issued this week.

Log in and enter the books you have read

- 1. Go to the PRC website NSW (just type premier's reading challenge into your web browser and make sure you are on the NSW site) and click on the log in tab on the left side of the page
- 2. You will be directed to the following page. Log in using you username and password. Please note the password is case and space sensitive, login exactly as the details show.



Once you have logged on you should be able to see your child's name at the top right of the page. You may be prompted to complete a brief survey.

On the left of the page click on the Student Reading Records tab and the **Personal Student Reading Record for your child should open.**

Using your child's paper personal reading record (in their diary or homework book) enter the PRC ID into the correct box then click add. The book should enter. If you do not know the ID you can enter the book by title or author.

Once the required number of books have been entered a box will indicate that you have finished the challenge. I will then need to validate the record and certificates will be issued at the end of Term 4.

PLEASE SEE ME OR ASK YOUR CHILD TO SEE ME (DURING SCHOOL AT LUNCH TIME) IF YOU HAVE ANY PROBLEMS.

Students who need some help completing the challenge should see me immediately to get the books required.


Mathematics: 2D Shapes



MORNING DROP-OFF

I would like to draw your attention to the need for all our families to be punctual of a morning in getting our children to school on time. The morning bell goes at 8:45am and it is important that the children are on their lines ready to move into school and begin their day. Late arrivals are causing additional work for our office ladies of a morning who have to record students who arrive after the bell as well as being disruptive to our classes. The beginning of our school day in each room involves our students beginning with prayer and teachers also conducting beginning of the day administration. It would also be greatly appreciated if the drive through drop off of a morning be done SAFELY and efficiently keeping long farewells to a minimum and drivers remaining in their cars.

THE SPEED LIMIT WITHIN THE SCHOOL GROUNDS IS 5-10KM AT ALL TIMES. Please observe the rules for morning drop-off as the safety of all children is paramount. It has been noted that a small number of the same parents are driving onto the top playground as soon as the bell rings AND / OR dropping children off in the wrong area. Children who are being dropped in the correct area are still walking across the playground while cars are coming in to park. Failure to comply with this request may result in a child / parent being seriously injured.

As we get closer to bell time long delays are being experienced at the drop off zone through to cars queuing on Statham Avenue. Your co-operation with these matters will be greatly appreciated and contribute to getting our school day started in a most time efficient manner and maintaining student safety.

A reminder that if you do arrive after the morning bell, you are required to park your vehicle and escort your child / children to the office to obtain a late pass.

AFTERNOON DRIVE-THROUGH

Over the last few weeks I have fielded several phone calls from members of the general public who have been caught up in the traffic on Statham Avenue of an afternoon as a result of the cars queuing to enter the school premises. We have been informed by several of our callers that the police were contacted and made aware of the traffic congestion that is being caused by our parent vehicles in both Statham Ave and North Rocks Road.

Vehicles queuing along North Rocks turning left into Statham Avenue are actually queuing illegally as there is a **No Stopping** zone adjacent to the school fence from the corner of the intersection down past our school driveway. If fined by the police or council parking inspectors you risk a fine of several hundred dollars and the loss of several points from your driver's license. Vehicles are also stopping across the pedestrian crossing at the lights as they queue in Statham Ave, which is also illegal but more importantly dangerous for all pedestrians attempting to cross at the lights. It is important that if you are coming along New North Rocks Road from either direction, do not turn into Statham Avenue and queue waiting to enter the school driveway. You will need to drive past and come around again.

The alternatives are to come from the southern end of Statham Avenue and turn right into the driveway which is legal or leave arriving at school to pick up your children five or ten minutes later. Every child does not have to be picked up at 2:55pm on the pick up. There are only so many vehicles we can have on the school premises on the drive through at any one time. I understand that this may cause a little inconvenience. Your compliance with this request will ensure however the safety of the pedestrians and save our parents the potential of being booked.

Your co-operation in this matter will be greatly appreciated by all members of the school community.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The process of initiation for children into the parish Catholic community of the faithful is celebrated in three sacramental moments: Baptism, first reception of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) and Confirmation.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a prerequisite for First Eucharist (for children in Year 3 and above) and will begin with a Parent Information Evening to be held in our parish church on **Thursday**, **6th September**, commencing at **7.30pm**. At this meeting the enrolment procedure, along with the program, will be explained and any questions answered.

All children (whether they attend Catholic or State schools) in our parish, prepare for the sacraments of First Reconciliation (Year 3 and above), First Eucharist (Year 4 and above) and Confirmation (Year 5/6 and above) in a program that is **parish based** (not school based) and **family centred**.

This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is important for parents/guardians to attend this meeting. Children are not required to attend this initial meeting.

To install it, just search for our school name "Christ the King Primary North Rocks" in either the Apple App Store, Google Play Store or on Windows.

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app



If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will <u>not</u> need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.</u>

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change
