After mass we will share a BBQ together in the parish hall and acknowledge our Spring Fair sponsors as well as presenting a cheque from the money raised to the Jesuit refugee service. If parishioners could assist by providing a salad or a dessert it would be gratefully appreciated. Also, assistance is required to set up tables and chairs in the MacKillop hall for the event on Saturday afternoon beginning at 1:30 PM. If you can assist on Saturday evening with the BBQ, please contact the school office. All the family and friends of our community are invited to share this great day next Saturday evening. Look forward to seeing you there.

Next Wednesday evening, [28 November 5:30 PM and 7:30 PM] approximately 60 children from our parish community will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. These children and their families have been preparing for this sacrament of healing for the last month and awaiting to receive God's unconditional love and forgiveness in a very special way. Friends and families of these children are welcome to join us next Wednesday evening as we celebrate as a parish community through prayer and song.

This week is the final week of the year the children will be able to borrow books from the library. All library books need to be returned by the end of next week [Friday 29th November]. In the final weeks of the term Mrs Cook and Mrs Grima will be conducting a stocktake in the library in preparation for the new school year. 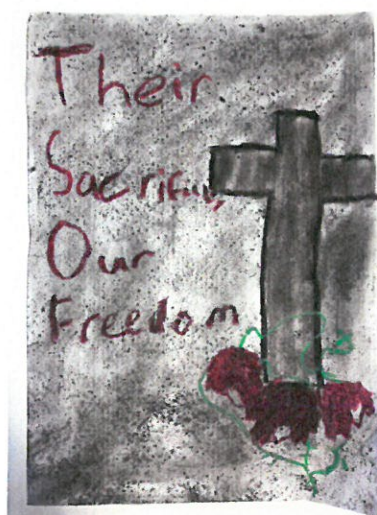
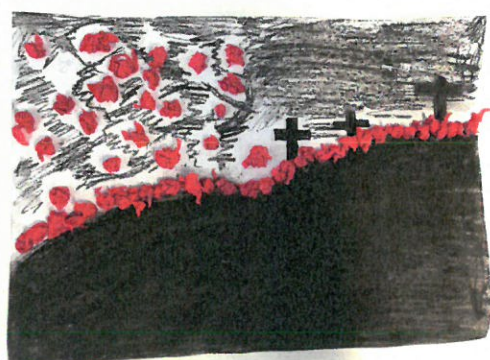
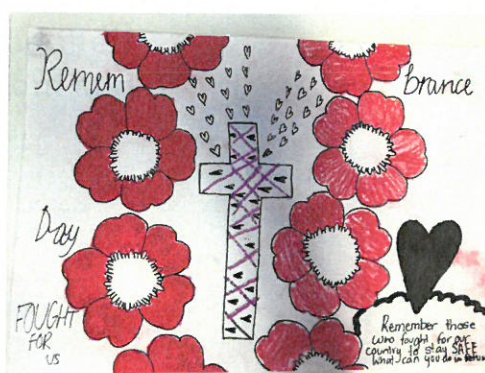

CTK Christmas Concert 2018 - Costumes

Please read carefully your child's costume outline.

Kindergarten Christmas Concert Costumes

Boys - denim shorts and a plain white T-shirt (no patterns or print)

Girls - denim shorts or skirt and a plain white T shirt (no patterns or print. Hair tied back in one neat ponytail.

All children- tinsel on wrists, white sandshoes and white socks

Year 1 Christmas Concert Costumes

All children in plain white t shirt (no pictures or print), shorts or skirt in red, green or silver (may have patterns), white socks and sandshoes.

Girls - hair in 1 neat ponytail at the back of their heads.

All children to have a set of reindeer antlers - any kind.

Year 2 Christmas Concert Costumes

Girls – All girls are to wear a pretty dress, with silver, gold or tan sandals and hair in high pigtails with ribbons tied in a bow.

Boys – All boys are to wear grey school shorts with a button up shirt or a polo shirt, white socks, black school shoes and hair spiked up.

Year 3 Christmas Concert Costumes

All students: All black clothes (pants, shorts, t-shirt, skirts or a dress) with no other colours/ images or prints, an akubra hat or straw hat for the second song and any shoes they like.

Girls are advised to wear a hairstyle that will not interfere with wearing a hat.

Year 4 Christmas Concert Costumes

The "Elves Presleys"

All students wear:

Elf hat with ears. (hair should be styled as to not interfere with the hat).

Black sunglasses (or similar)

A heat source is something that makes its own heat. For example :

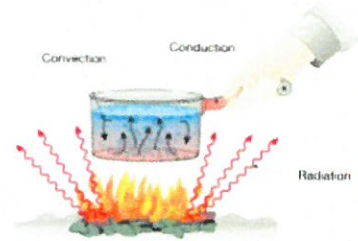
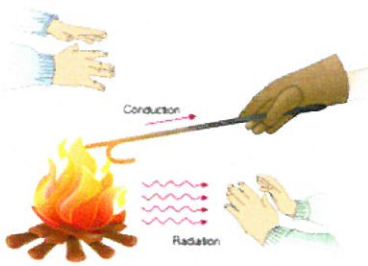

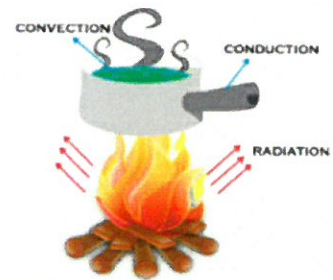
Conduction

When you put something that contains all mental, put it on something hot that will make conduction.

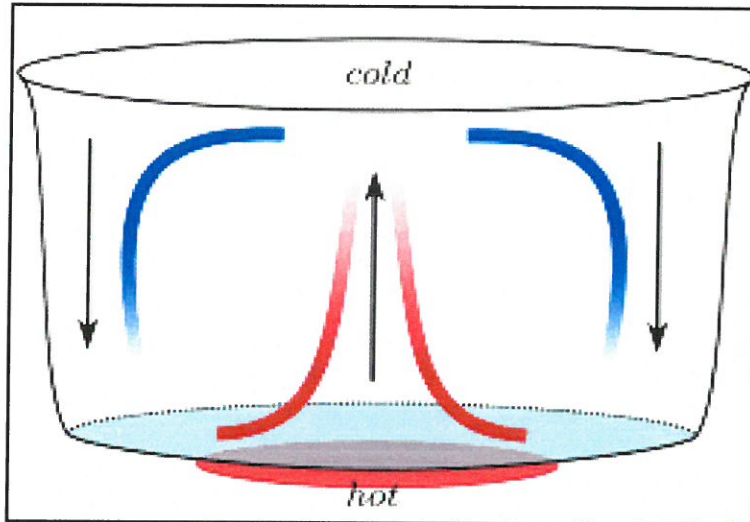
Or if you are hot and someone is cold when you hug them you will make them get hotter.

Skoolbag is the ultimate school to parent communication tool. This School Mobile App provides schools with an easy way to tell parents and carers important information as soon as it happens example: school news, event reminders, cancellations and much more.

To install it, just search for our school name "Christ the King Primary North Rocks" in either the Apple App Store, Google Play Store or on Windows.

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app



If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.
System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. Open Skoolbag app
2. Click on eForms
3. Select Absentee Form
4. Complete all fields
5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) **COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas) : Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave. (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e : it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY ALL PARENT VOLUNTEERS INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the ‘Volunteer Form’ and the ‘Module’ have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

‘Building Child Safe Communities’ is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. **It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form** that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

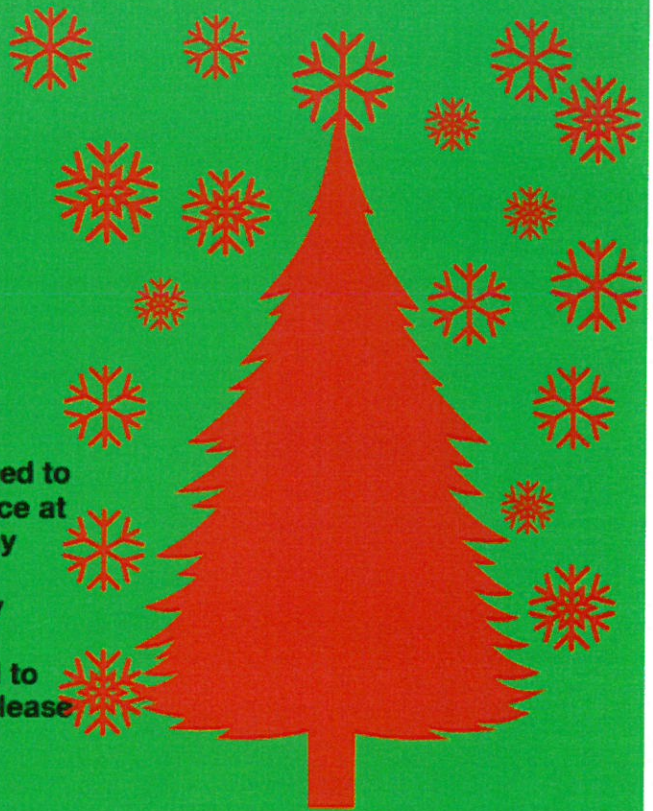
