Dear Parents.

As members of a Catholic School and Parish and members of God's family we are encouraged to come together each Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist through the celebration of Mass. As we begin the new school year, it is a great opportunity for us to reflect on why it is important for us to attend Mass each Sunday with our families. Why do we come to Mass? Fr Michael Fallon, in his writings this week has come up with the answer that we can ponder upon. We come to meet others in our faith-family, to pray with each other and to receive the risen Jesus in the extraordinary intimacy of communion. These evenings are for parents only and an integral component for commencing the year on a very positive and practical note. Please note that these nights [Yr 1-6] are not designed for one on one interviews with the teachers. If you need to speak to your child's teacher, please make an appointment through the school office. I look forward to catching with you all at these meetings next week.

Please be reminded that there are allocated parking spots adjacent to the church and library for disabled parking. SCHOOL CENSUS DAY MONDAY, 18th February, 2019

Monday 18th February is School Census Day. All children should attend school on that day and absence should only be if it is absolutely necessary.

This is of course a requirement that applies to everyday of the school year, however, Census data is directly related to Government funding for our schools and the requirements outlined above are set by the Department of Education.

Morning Drop-Off

Parents are reminded that when dropping off their children in the morning the following guidelines apply:

- * Supervision of children begins at 8:15am
- * Always drive less than 5km per hour within the school grounds
- * Always have children leave the vehicle on the passenger side only
- * Always drop off near the first gate of the COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area) in the morning where children can walk directly through the gate into the safety of the school grounds
- * If you are taking your child to the COHSC, parking under the COLA is prohibited after 8.10am. You must park your car in a designated parking space and walk your child into the COHSC Centre
- * Morning Drop-Off is exactly that—please do not park your car and get out to assist your child. This causes disruption to the drop-off routine. It is suggested that students hold their school bags on their laps for an easy exit out of the car.

Only park in <u>designated</u> parking spaces around the hall, never on the top playground unless there is a major school function, and only then after 9.00am as latecomers may still be walking across the playground.

STUDENT COLLECTION FROM ON-SITE AFTER-SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Parent access for collection of students from the above-mentioned after school activities will be from the ramp near the Administration Building. Parents are to safely park in a designated parking space and get out of your car to collect your children.

Children will NOT BE ALLOWED TO WALK OUT ONTO THE RAMP WITHOUT A PARENT.

Parish Spring Fair raises \$7600 for JRS!

What is the secret ingredient to launching an amazing event like the Christ the King Spring Fair? According to two Parish Organisers, it is "working as part of a team" and "building a community."

In September, the North Rocks school and parish community hosted a Spring Fair. Each year, the initiative of hosting the fair is taken up by the local Catholic Parish located in North Rocks between Parramatta and Pennant Hills. Funds raised go to the parish, the Church and to Christ the King Primary School. This year, 10 per cent was allocated to a designated charity. JRS was delighted to find that we had been selected by the parish to be the chosen charity of 2018.

In total, our JRS Arrupe Project Manager, Maeve Brown carried back a very large cheque worth \$7600, presented by Bishop Vincent Long at a special mass in November. This generosity is enormously helpful in allowing JRS to perform our work in assisting people seeking asylum and refugees in Australia. On receiving the 5ft long cheque, Maeve smiled appreciatively, "I was glad that I was given a lift so I didn't have to take the bus back home that day."

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app



If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL



- 1. Open Skoolbag app
- 2. Click on eForms
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- 5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
- 6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will <u>not</u> need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm on the Skoolbag App is not to be used for extended Family leave.

- Request for Family leave (1-5 days) must be emailed to the Principal. If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.
- For Family leave over 5 days, an Application for Extended Leave must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to departure. *If travelling overseas, an itinerary must accompany this application.*

STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS (any leave other than student sick leave) COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school.

Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel

1-5 days absence: Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, an Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel documents must attach Overseas applications.

5-100 days absence (whether travelling in Australia or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved the Principal issues a Certificate of Extended Leave. If the principal declines this application (i.e: it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behaviour whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centres. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change


